Ordinance No. 2018-60Passed August 1, 2018

SPONSOR: STREETS COMMITTEE

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE OHIO EPA'S DIESEL MITIGATION TRUST FUND, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) has invited owners of eligible medium and heavy-duty diesel fleets in 26 Ohio priority counties to apply for grants to repower or replace diesel vehicles and equipment with new clean diesel, alternative fuel (CNG, LNG, propane, diesel electric hybrid) or all-electric vehicles and equipment; and,

WHEREAS, Mogadore is situated in one of the priority counties; and,

WHEREAS, this program is supported with funds from Ohio's allocation under the Volkswagen Mitigation Trust Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Portage and Summit, Ohio as follows:

SECTION 1: That the Mayor of the Village of Mogadore, Village Engineer and other Village Officials are hereby authorized and directed to promptly apply for a funding grant under Section 4.3 for a Class 8 local freight truck, or any other vehicle known by the Village that is applicable.

SECTION 2: That the Mayor, Village Engineer and other Village Officials are hereby authorized and directed to sign all necessary paperwork to effectuate the application for and entering of, execution and implementation of said grant.

SECTION 3: That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

SECTION 4: That, to the extent not already done so, the funds required for the payment of the obligations incurred are hereby appropriated for the purposes described.

SECTION 5: That this Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with the applicable legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
