RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF LAW ENFORCEMENT BODY ARMOR, AUTHORIZING THE POLICE CHIEF TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR THE OHIO ATTORNEY GENERAL'S BODY ARMOR PROGRAM, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Ohio Attorney General's office has established a program wherein it reimburses local law enforcement agencies as a part of its body armor program; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Mogadore Police Department has been awarded \$10,753.88 in reimbursement under the Ohio Attorney General's Ohio Law Enforcement Body Armor Program.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: That the Police Chief and Clerk Treasurer are authorized and directed to purchase body armor as specified in Exhibit "A," the program budget submitted by the Village Police Department to the Ohio Attorney General in its application for this program.

Section 2: That upon purchase and receipt of the body armor as identified in Exhibit "A," the Police Chief is directed to timely submit a Reimbursement Application to the Ohio Attorney General's Office seeking the \$10,753.88 reimbursement award that has been granted. The application is attached as Exhibit "B." The Police Chief and/or Clerk-Treasurer are further directed to accurately, and in a timely fashion, complete all such paperwork necessary to receive reimbursement for the purchased body armor and related equipment from any program in which the Village is entitled to participate.

Section 3: That, to the extent not already done so, the funds required for the payment of the obligations incurred are hereby appropriated for the purposes described.

Section 4: That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

Section 5: That this Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with the applicable legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
