

Council met in regular session at 5:40 p.m. following the public hearing with Mayor Michael Rick presiding.

Mr. M. Kelly asked everyone to join him in a moment of reflection for their own intentions. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited by all.

Roll Call – Ms. K. Miller, p; Mr. M. Kelly, p; Mr. R. Schrock, p; Mr. M. Raddish, p; Ms. B. Van Dike, p; Mr. R. McDowall, p; Mr. C. Yoho, p.

Motion by Mr. M. Raddish, second by Mr. R. Schrock for the approval of the agenda as presented. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. M. Raddish, second by Ms. K. Miller to adopt the minutes of the October 17, 2018 Council meeting. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

COMMENTS ON PENDING LEGISLATION – No comments.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

PARKS – Ms. Miller had no report.

UTILITIES – Mr. McDowall had no report

SAFETY – Mr. Kelly had no report.

STREETS – Mr. Yoho had no report.

PLANNING AND ZONING – Mr. Schrock announced on Monday, November 12 there will be Zoning Board of Appeals meeting with one issue.

Mr. M. Kelly said that he was at the Avenue Deli and the owners asked him why they received a citation and did not understand it. Mayor Rick answered that the business has too many signs on the building, on a tree in the devil strip and on the pole. They were in violation of three ordinances as stated in the citation. He told Mr. Kelly to tell the owners to contact the municipal office.

Mr. R. Schrock asked what is the Village doing about the business at 67 S. Cleveland Ave. The Mayor replied that we have sent citations and the owner has chose to ignore. We will be following up to get this property cleaned up.

Mayor Rick said that he has asked the Law Director to look into if the Village can do to have old pole signs on abandon business properties removed. If there is nothing in our ordinances, we will bring the issue to legislation.

FINANCE/AUDIT – Ms. Van Dike reported she has two resolutions to read.

Mr. Raddish announced the next work session will be Wednesday, November 28 at 5:30 will all committees reporting. He also reminded council that November's second council meeting will be Tuesday, November 20 due to Thanksgiving.

OLD BUSINESS – Mr. R. Schrock presented the second reading of Ordinance 2018-80 as follows:

Mr. M. Kelly presented Resolution 2018-82 sponsored by the Safety Committee as follows:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF A HEATER FOR THE VILLAGE FIRE STATION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Mr. M. Kelly made a motion to suspend the rule requiring three readings; Mr. C. Yoho seconded the motion. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. M. Kelly to adopt Resolution 2018-82; a second was made by Mr. R. Schrock. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

Mr. M. Kelly presented Resolution 2018-83 sponsored by the Safety Committee as follows:

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND/OR POLICE CHIEF TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE CITY OF TALLMADGE REGARDING ITS K-9 PROGRAM AND TO AUTHORIZE PAYMENT REGARDING THE SAME AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Mr. M. Kelly made a motion to suspend the rule requiring three readings; Mr. C. Yoho seconded the motion. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Kelly to adopt Resolution 2018-83; a second was made by Mr. C. Yoho.

Mr. R. McDowall asked why the new Memorandum of Understanding was not attached. Mr. M. Pitchford stated that we have not received it from the City of Tallmadge.

After discussion, Mr. M. Kelly made a motion to withdraw the passing of Resolution 2018-83; a second was made by Mr. R. Schrock. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

Mr. M. Kelly made a motion to suspend the vote of the rule requiring three readings; a second was made by Mr. R. Schrock.

Mayor Rick said that this will be the first reading.

Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

Mr. R. Schrock presented Resolution 2018-84 sponsored by Mr. R. Schrock as follows:

RESOLUTION OPPOSING PROPOSED "RIGHT TO WORK" CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS AND SUPPORTING FAIR LABOR PRACTICES TO SUPPORT WORKING FAMILIES AND THE ECONOMY OF THE VILLAGE OF MOGADORE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Mr. R. Schrock made a motion to suspend the rule requiring three readings; Mr. R. McDowall seconded the motion. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. R. Schrock to adopt Resolution 2018-84; a second was made by Ms. B. Van Dike.

There was a discussion between Mr. R. Schrock and Mr. M. Kelly regarding their interpretation of the "Right to Work" laws. One of the points of discussion was donation of union dues to political parties. Mr. M. Raddish remarked that he likes both sides of the discussion. Mr. R. McDowall stated that he feels that with "Right to Work", workers get the benefits without paying for them. He also said when he ran for a State seat as a Democrat, his opponent received more from the union than he did. He thinks the unions are spreading the dues between the political parties.

Vote. Schrock, yes; Van Dike, no; McDowall, yes; Yoho, yes; Miller, yes; Kelly, no; Raddish, yes; Motion carried with a 5-2 vote.

Mayor Rick presented Resolution 2018-85 as follows:

RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION 2012-54 AUTHORIZING PART-TIME VILLAGE EMPLOYEES TO FILL A TEMPORARY POSITION WITH THE STREET DEPARTMENT, ESTABLISHING COMPENSATION FOR THE POSITION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Ms. B. Van Dike made a motion to suspend the rule requiring three readings; Ms. K. Miller seconded the motion. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. R. Schrock to adopt Resolution 2018-85; a second was made by Ms. K. Miller.

Mayor Rick announced that during leaf pick-up, one employee will receive \$13.50. He has been during this job since 2012 and has not had a raise; the \$1.50 raise equals a 2% raise since that time equal \$13.50. The second part-time employee will receive \$12.00 per hour.

Mayor Rick would like to amend Section 1 of the resolution to read starting November 6, 2018 because the leaf pick-up program began November 7, 2018.

A motion was made by Mr. M. Raddish to amend Section 1 of Resolution 2018-85; a second was made by Mr. M. Kelly. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

Mr. Raddish stated that he was against this raise at the last work session. After discussing the issue with the Mayor, he agrees that it is a good pay for a lot of hard work. Plus, this can be review again next year.

Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

Ms. B. Van Dike presented Resolution 2018-86 sponsored by the Finance Committee as follows:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFERS WITHIN FUNDS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Ms. B. Van Dike make a motion to suspend the rule requiring three readings; Mr. C. Yoho seconded the motion. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ms. B. Van Dike to adopt Resolution 2018-86; a second was made by Mr. C. Yoho. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

Ms. B. Van Dike presented Resolution 2018-87 sponsored by the Finance Committee as follows:

RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE AMOUNTS AND RATES AS DETERMINED BY THE BUDGET COMMISSION AND AUTHORIZING THE NECESSARY TAX LEVIES AND CERTIFYING THEM TO THE COUNTY FISCAL OFFICER AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Ms. B. Van Dike made a motion to suspend the rule requiring three readings; Mr. C. Yoho seconded the motion. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ms. B. Van Dike to adopt Resolution 2018-87; a second was made by Mr. C. Yoho. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

COMMENTS ON THE BILLS - Ms. B. Van Dike made a motion to approve the payment of the bills as presented on the invoice report; Mr. R. Schrock seconded the motion. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

COMMENTS from the Public: No comments.

COMMENTS from Council: Mr. M. Raddish stated that he was disappointed the two village issues on the November 6 ballot did not pass. He asked what our next steps will be. Mayor Rick said that council would need to discuss this issue in work session. The ballot language would have to be presented to the counties in February. Akron will have issues for the May 2019 election so there would be some cost sharing.

COMMENTS from the Clerk-Treasurer: The police department has a court ordered vehicle at Adorni's Service per agreement. The police department would like to auction the vehicle through GovDeals, an internet auction and to do so legislation will need to be presented.

Mayor Rick said that this would not be the only vehicle auctioned; the Fire Department has a vehicle and the Police Department has close to 20 bicycles. He would ask Chief Higgins, Scott and Marshall to discuss how to put these items up for the internet auction.

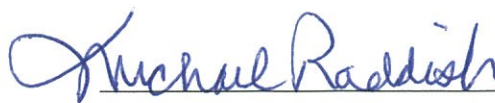
Chief Higgins had mentioned to the Mayor about donating the bicycles. The Mayor told him if he found somewhere to donate them to, come to council for approval.
