Ordinance-No. 2019-47Passed June 5, 2019

SPONSOR: FINANCE COMMITTEE

A RESOLUTION AMENDING RETROACTIVELY SECTION 1 OF RESOLUTION 2018-32 FOR THE CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE VILLAGE OF MOGADORE, PROVIDING FOR THE TERMS AND PROVISIONS OF SUCH APPOINTMENT AND ESTABLISHING COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Todd F. Higgins, a resident of the Village of Mogadore, has been appointed as the Chief of Police of the Village of Mogadore by the Mayor effective August 10, 2013;

WHEREAS, such appointment has been approved by the Village Council in accordance with Article VII, Section 7.03 of the Mogadore Village Charter;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide a raise in salary to said position and to provide for the terms and provisions of said appointment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: That Section 1 of Resolution 2018-32 shall be amended to state as follows:

That effective retroactively as of June 1, 2019, the Chief of Police shall be paid an annual salary of \$79,215.90. In addition, the Chief will receive a clothing and equipment allowance of \$1,100.00. All other economic benefits contained in the current collective bargaining agreement between the Village and its Patrol Officers and Sergeants shall inure to the Chief of Police.

SECTION 2: This Resolution shall be effective retroactively as of June 1, 2019.

SECTION 3: The Village of Mogadore finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements

SECTION 4: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the residents of the Village of Mogadore and to assure that the Chief of Police shall commence his duties and responsibilities as soon as practicable and shall take effect and be in force upon its approval by the Mayor or at the earliest period allowed by law.
