SPONSOR: STREETS COMMITTEE

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SELL UNNEEDED PERSONAL PROPERTY (1992 INTERNATIONAL DUMP TRUCK) AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village owns personal property, i.e. a 1992 International Dump Truck, that it no longer needs and now desires to sell;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the Village to sell the foregoing property as it is presently being under-utilized and counterproductive for the needs of the Village at this time; and,

WHEREAS, the Village has previously authorized the sale of such property by online auction.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Portage and Summit, Ohio, as follows:

SECTION 1: That it is in the best interests of the Village of Mogadore and its operations to sell unfit, obsolete and/or unneeded personal property, which is a 1992 International Dump Truck.

SECTION 2: This identified personal property is hereby found to be unneeded, as it was forfeited to the Village as a part of a criminal prosecution.

SECTION 3: That the Mayor and Clerk-Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to sell the aforesaid personal property in a reasonably commercial fashion, either by (a) bid or (b) on Govdeals.com as previously authorized and contracted.

SECTION 4: If the vehicle is sold online, the internet auction shall satisfy the statutory minimum of ten (10) days (including Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays) for bidding on the property.

SECTION 5: Advertising for the internet auction is hereby directed and shall be accomplished in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code and the 2020 Mogadore legislation on this topic.

SECTION 6: That Council does not set a minimum price to be accepted for this specific vehicle and any other terms and conditions for a particular sale, unless the vehicle is sold online. In that event, the terms and conditions set forth in the Village's agreement with GovDeals, Inc. online auction company shall be provided on the internet at the time of the auction. Under either sale option, the Mayor may set a minimum price.

SECTION 7: That no proceeds from the internet sales shall be paid in cash, rather all proceeds shall be delivered to the Clerk-Treasurer by cashier or bank check, or electronic transfer to the Village's general fund with verification of receipt delivered to the Clerk-Treasurer.

SECTION 8: That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

SECTION 9: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in a duly noticed virtual, open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with all applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code and HB 197 during the state-declared COVID-19 emergency.

SECTION 10: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety of the Village residents and to allow for the continued operations of the Village Service Department and other departments and shall therefore take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage.
