Ordinance No. 2021-14Passed MARCH 3, 2021

SPONSOR: SAFETY COMMITTEE

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2018-51, SECTION 1, REGARDING THE WAGES FOR PART-TIME POLICE OFFICERS IN THE VILLAGE OF MOGADORE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Section 3.10 of the Charter provides Council with the authority to create positions, duties, compensation and fix qualifications for Village employees; and,

WHEREAS, Council has previously deemed it necessary and advisable to create part-time police officer positions within the Village of Mogadore Police Department; and,

WHEREAS, The Chief of the Mogadore Police Department has requested an increase in the hourly wages paid to part-time police officers; and,

WHEREAS, Council has determined that these changes are necessary to maintain adequate staffing of part-time police officers and to continue to attract qualified applicants when a part-time vacancy exists in the police department; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio that:

SECTION 1: Effective beginning at the Police Departments next pay period, the part-time police officer positions shall be compensated at the starting hourly rate of \$15.99 per hour until successful completion of the training period with the department. Upon successful completion of the training, compensation will then be increased to \$18.49 per hour. In addition, part-time police officers will receive a clothing and equipment allowance of \$500.00 annually.

SECTION 2: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in a duly noticed virtual, open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with all applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code and HB 404 during the state-declared COVID-19 emergency.

SECTION 3: Council declares this ordinance to be an emergency measure immediately and necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Mogadore, and for reasons that concern the efficient operation of the Village Police Department, provided that this legislation receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) of the members elected or appointed to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
