Resolution No. 2021-71

SPONSOR: STREETS COMMITTEE

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF MOGADORE TO PARTNER WITH SUMMIT COUNTY AND/OR THE CITY OF AKRON, PREPARE AND SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION STATE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM(S), AND TO EXECUTE CONTRACTS AS REQUIRED, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Public Works Commission has funding available for public works improvements; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Mogadore, as part of the application process for these funds, has identified the need for the Infrastructure Project, Fenton Avenue from Curtis Street to Mogadore Road and Dick Street from Fenton Avenue to Pearl Avenue; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Mogadore has committed to fund its local share of costs associated with the improvement; and,

WHEREAS, the State Capital Improvement Program and the Local Transportation Improvement Program both provide financial assistance to political subdivisions for capital improvements to public infrastructure; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Mogadore is planning to make capital improvements to Fenton Avenue from Curtis Street to Mogadore Road and Dick Street from Fenton Avenue to Pearl Avenue 2022; and,

WHEREAS, the infrastructure improvement hereinabove described is considered to be a priority need for the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Portage and Summit, Ohio as follows:

SECTION 1: That the Mayor, Clerk-Treasurer and, Village Engineer are authorized to act as a partner in a joint project with the County of Summit and/or the City of Akron to seek funding approval from the Ohio Public Works Commission for the Infrastructure Project, Fenton Avenue from Curtis Street to Mogadore Road and Dick Street from Fenton Avenue to Pearl Avenue 2022 Reconstruction.

SECTION 2: The Village of Mogadore will commit to provide its share of the local funding through general notes and bonds to construct the sewer improvement.

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SECTION 3: The Mayor and/or Village Engineer are hereby authorized to apply to the OPWC for funds as described above.

SECTION 4: The Mayor is authorized to enter into any agreements as may be necessary and appropriate for obtaining this financial assistance.

SECTION 5: That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

SECTION 6: That, to the extent not already done so, the funds required for the payment of the obligations incurred are hereby appropriated for the purposes described.

SECTION 7: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in a duly noticed virtual, open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with all applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 8: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and general welfare of Village residents, to allow for the timely submission of the OPWC application within guidelines and requirements, to allow for the prompt studies and remediation efforts to begin when the weather will first allow, and to allow for the continued operations of the Village Administration and other departments and shall, therefore, take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage.
