SPONSOR: SAFETY COMMITTEE

A RESOLUTION DECLARING POLICE DEPARTMENT RADIOS UNNEEDED AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO DONATE THEM TO THE MOGADORE LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Village owns personal property, i.e. numerous Village Police Department's radios (walkie-talkies), that it no longer needs and now desires to donate;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the Village to donate the foregoing property as it is presently being under-utilized and counterproductive for the needs of the Village at this time; and,

WHEREAS, the Village Council desires the Police Department to continue supporting the Mogadore Local School District through the donation of such property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Portage and Summit, Ohio, as follows:

SECTION 1: That it is in the best interests of the Village of Mogadore and its operations to donate the unneeded property, which is the aforesaid radios.

SECTION 2: This identified personal property is hereby found to be unneeded.

SECTION 3: That the Mayor, Clerk-Treasurer, and/or the Mayor's designee is hereby authorized and directed to donate the aforesaid personal property to the Mogadore Local School District for its use in the safety and protection of its students and staff.

SECTION 4: That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

SECTION 5: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in a duly noticed open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with all applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 6: That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the Village residents and to allow for the continued operations of the Village Police Department and other departments and shall therefore take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage.
