COUNCIL MEETING

December 7, 2022

Council met in regular session at 5:30 p.m. with Mayor Rick presiding.

Ms. B. Van Dike asked everyone to join her in a moment of reflection for their own intentions. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was recited by all.

Council Meeting was held in Council Chambers. The meeting was open to the public and live-streamed on Facebook.

Roll Call: Council Members Present: Mr. R. McDowall, Ms. B. Van Dike, Mr. M. Raddish, Mr. J. Tonsic, Mr. W. Bauer, and Ms. K. Miller. Councilman Mr. C. Yoho was excused from the meeting.

Others Present: Mayor Rick, Council Clerk Rachel Osborne, Clerk-Treasurer Scott Varney, and Marshal Pitchford.

Motion by Mr. M. Raddish, second by Ms. K. Miller for the approval of the agenda as presented. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. M. Raddish, second by Mr. W. Bauer to adopt the minutes from the November 16, 2022, Council meeting. Vote. Unanimous ayes. Motion carried.

<u>COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE ON PENDING LEGISLATION</u> – Carl Housley, 67 First Avenue, asked what the reason for the \$40,000 EMS transfer was listed on Resolution 2022-80.

Clerk-Treasurer Scott Varney stated the EMS fund was for wage increases earlier in the year.

Housley asked for more clarification regarding Resolution 2022-84 for a new medical unit/ambulance for the Fire Department. Housley asked why the unit is being sent out on calls if it is unreliable.

Pitchford stated the legislation is for a new remount for the current unit to be refurbished before it would be considered unreliable.

Housley asked why the Fire Department sends their new unit on all mutual aid calls and not the old unit.

Mayor Rick told Housley would talk with Chief Cain and get back to him.

Mayor Rick indicated that the Village pays 100% and has been for years.

June Long, 4061 Etter Road, stated what a great job Gary Maag and Nick Shutler have done at the Cemetery. Long asked Law Director Marshal Pitchford to indicate who can run/serve as Mayor after the Charter Amendment passed.

Pitchford explained those who have local, state, and federal jobs are unable to serve as Mayor. Pitchford said that he brought this to the Charter Review Commission to put on the ballot. Pitchford said he felt the existing

language in the Charter was unclear and needed clarity. Pitchford felt the new language legally protects the Village.

<u>COMMENTS from Council</u>: Raddish stated he was glad Pitchford cleared that up and that Pitchford, not Raddish, was the one who started the process for the Charter Amendment.

COMMENTS from the Law Director: No Comments.

<u>COMMENTS</u> from the Village <u>Engineer</u>: Matt Glass thanked the council for allowing GPD and himself to continue working with the Village.

A RESOLUTION AMENDING SECTION 1 OF RESOLUTION NO. 2021-74; ESTABLISHING THE COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS FOR THE POSITION OF FIRE CHIEF AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it is the recommendation of the Mayor and the Finance/Audit Committee that the Fire Chief be given a raise;

WHEREAS, Section 3.10 of the Charter provides Council with the authority to create positions, duties, compensation, and fix qualifications for Village Employees;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: That Section 1 of Resolution 2021-74 shall be amended and state as follows:

The compensation for the position of full-time Fire Chief shall be \$86,149.08 annually, which shall be payable bi-weekly. In addition, the Fire Chief shall receive an annual clothing and equipment allowance of \$1,250.00.

SECTION 2: This Resolution shall be effective as of January 1, 2023.

SECTION 3: That employment benefits to be provided to the full-time Fire Chief shall be the same as those provided other full-time, non-bargaining unit employees of the Village.

SECTION 4: The Village of Mogadore finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements

SECTION 5: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the residents of the Village of Mogadore and to address and properly provide for the wages and benefits for the position of Fire Chief and shall take effect and be in force upon its approval by the Mayor or at the earliest period allowed by law.

A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 2021-75 EXHIBIT "A" AND SECTION 2, PROVIDING PAY SCALE AND BENEFITS FOR PART-TIME VILLAGE FIRE OFFICERS AND FIREFIGHTERS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the recommendation of the Mayor and the Finance/Audit Committee, the pay scale for Part-Time Fire Department personnel shall be increased by 3.25%.

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the recommendation of the Mayor and the Finance/Audit Committee, the overnight pay scale for Fire Department personnel shall be eliminated and standard rates, as applicable to each member of the Fire Department shall apply.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: That Exhibit "A" to Resolution 2021-75 be replaced in its entirety with Exhibit "A" hereto. The terms and conditions of the new wage and benefit package for the Part-Time Village Fire Officers and Firefighters are set forth in their entirety in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, which is incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2: That Section 2 of Resolution 2021-75 be amended to state as follows:

This Resolution shall be effective as of December 31, 2022.

SECTION 3: All other ordinances, resolutions, or parts of other ordinances and resolutions which may be in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared null and void and are of no further force and effect.

SECTION 4: The Village of Mogadore finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 5: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the proper protection of the Village against fire and other emergencies and for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the residents of the Village of Mogadore and shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor or at the earliest period allowed by law.

SHIFT LEAD \$ 2.00 per hour additional to License rate

- B. Subject to the Fire Chief's approval, pay will be at time and half (1.5) the rate for hours worked over eight (8) in a twenty-four (24) hour period when **responding from home and** at an incident.
- C. All probationary firefighters will be paid one dollar (\$1.00) less an hour than their licensed rate while on probation.
- D. Each member of the fire department shall be compensated for a minimum of 2 hours when responding to an emergency alarm, not on duty. All time above and beyond 2 hours shall be calculated to the half hour
- E. The Shift Lead position shall be paid to the senior member on that shift when an officer is not working that shift. Captains, Assistant Chief and Chief are not eligible for the shift lead pay and shall be considered shift lead when working. Those acting as Shift lead shall ensure shift truck checks are completed, shift housekeeping tasks are completed, fire and ems reports are completed and all pertinent information is relayed to the oncoming shift lead or Chief. This includes but not limited to mechanical issues with vehicles or equipment, personnel issues, or issues regarding emergency calls. Members must be off probation in order to qualify for shift lead pay.

WHEREAS, Todd F. Higgins, has been appointed as the Chief of Police of the Village of Mogadore by the Mayor effective August 10, 2013;

WHEREAS, such appointment has been approved by the Village Council in accordance with Article VII, Section 7.03 of the Mogadore Village Charter;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide a raise in salary to said position and to provide for the terms and provisions of said appointment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: That Section 1 of Resolution 2021-76 shall be amended to state as follows:

That effective as of January 1, 2023, the Chief of Police shall be paid an annual salary of \$86,149.08. In addition, the Chief will receive a clothing and equipment allowance of \$1,250.00 annually. All other economic benefits contained in the current collective bargaining agreement between the Village and its Patrol Officers and Sergeants shall inure to the Chief of Police.

SECTION 2: This Resolution shall be effective as of January 1, 2023.

SECTION 3: The Village of Mogadore finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements

SECTION 4: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the residents of the Village of Mogadore and to assure that the Chief of Police shall commence his duties and responsibilities as soon as practicable and shall take effect and be in force upon its approval by the Mayor or at the earliest period allowed by law.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO AMEND THE 2022 CONTRACT PREVIOUSLY ENTERED INTO WITH THE OHIO PATROLMEN'S BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION BY ENTERING A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS: Full-time patrolmen and sergeants employed by the Village of Mogadore Police Department are members of the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association ("OPBA"); and,

WHEREAS: Policing services provided by these employees are governed by the terms and conditions set forth in contracts between the Village and the OPBA ("the Contract"); and,

WHEREAS: The current Contract with these employees, which covers 2021 through 2023, must be amended and approved by this Council; and,

WHEREAS: The Village, and the OPBA have negotiated an amendment to the Contract that changes Article 32, Section 1; and,

WHEREAS, the amendment will serve the best interests of the Village residents; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, the State of Ohio that:

SECTION 1: The Mayor is authorized and directed to execute a Memorandum of Understanding("MOU") that retroactively amends the 2021-2023 contract entered into between the OPBA and the Village of Mogadore. The MOU shall be in a form substantially similar to the one attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein.

- 2) Insurance coverage shall be also provided for the surviving spouse and/or eligible children of a deceased employee for a period of three (3) months after death.
- 3) The Employer will provide and pay the full premium for all full-time employees for a life insurance policy in the face of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00).
- 4) The Employer expressly reserves the right to change insurance coverage or carriers, so long as the new coverage meets the requirements contained within Section 1, Section 2, Section 3, and Section 4, contained herein.

I am pleased to present this engagement letter to you, on behalf of the Village of Mogadore ("Village") for Roetzel and Andress, LPA ("Roetzel") to furnish legal services and counsel to the Mayor and Council as Village Solicitor. Such legal services include, but are not limited to, providing advice and counsel to the Mayor, Council and other officials of the Village; attendance at Village Council meetings and other Village meets at the discretion of the Village; drafting and reviewing legislation presented to Village Council; preparing and reviewing contracts wherein the Village is a party; representing the Village on employment and labor matters; representing the Village on real estate, zoning, planning and land-use matters; representing the Village on matters involving litigation; and representing the Village on other legal matters at the discretion of the Village. A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF MOGADORE TO JOIN THE COMMUNITY UNIVERSITY EDUCATION PURCHASING COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Village of Mogadore was previously a member of the Community University Education Purchasing Cooperative for the purpose of lowering costs by joining within other governmental entities through pooled purchasing and competitive bidding; and,

WHEREAS, it was necessary to reorganize the Community University Education Purchasing cooperative as a Council of Governments organized under Chapter 167 of the Revised Code; and,

WHEREAS, Copley Township, the City of Green, the City of Akron, the Village of Boston Heights, the City of Kent, and the City of Cuyahoga Falls (the "Initial Members") entered into the Agreement Establishing the Community Education Purchasing Regional Council of Governments ("CUE") under Chapter 167 of the Revised Code; and

WHEREAS, the Establishing Agreement authorized the Initial Members of the CUE to adopt bylaws to govern the operation of CUE and the Initial Members adopted the bylaws on October 5, 2022 (the "Bylaws"); and

WHEREAS, Article II Section 2 authorizes the Initial Political Subdivisions listed on Schedule 1 of the Bylaws to join CUE as a Member (as defined in the Establishing Agreement and the Bylaws") without an additional financial contribution; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Mogadore has determined to join CUE as a Member.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Portage and Summit, Ohio as follows:

SECTION 1: That this Council has determined that the Village of Mogadore shall join CUE as a Member.

SECTION 2: That Mayor Mike Rick is hereby designated as the Representative of the Village of Mogadore to serve on the Governing Board of CUE.

SECTION 3: That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2023 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

SECTION 3: The Village of Mogadore finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were taken in a dully noticed virtual open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law, including Section 121.22, Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the Village and the inhabitants, and for the further reason that the immediate effectiveness of this Ordinance is necessary to establish the Village's annual appropriation and to set aside the necessary funds in order to ensure the timely performance of Village operations and the timely payment of Village current expenses and obligations during the period beginning January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023, and provided this Ordinance receives the approval of two-thirds of the members of Council, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approved by the Mayor, or otherwise take effect and be in full force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
