## COUNCIL MEETING

January 18, 2023

Council met in regular session at 5:30 p.m. with Mayor Rick presiding.

SPONSOR: STREETS COMMITTEE

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT TO PURCHASE A JOHNSTON VT 650 STREET SWEEPER FROM BROWN EQUIPMENT COMPANY ON AN EMERGENCY BASIS FOR USE BY THE STREET DEPARTMENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Section 14.03 of the Village's Charter provides that all purchases exceeding one-half (1/2) of the statutory threshold of \$50,000.00 shall be undertaken by advertising for and accepting sealed bids, except when five (5) members of this Council determine the purchase should proceed without such sealed bids due to an emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Village's Street Department recently determined that its street sweeper can no longer properly function and is beyond reasonable condition to sweep streets in the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village has received a quote from Brown Equipment Company for a Johnston VT 650 street sweeper at a cost not to exceed \$90,000.00, less any applicable trade-in value for the Village's current street sweeper; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency recognizes street sweeping as a stormwater pollution prevention practice, and it is necessary for the Village to have a fully functional street sweeper prior to the commencement of street sweeping season; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village of Mogadore to authorize the Mayor to enter into an agreement to purchase the Johnston VT 650 street sweeper from Brown Equipment Company at a cost not to exceed \$90,000.00, less any applicable trade-in value for the Village's current street sweeper, and this Council further finds and determines that purchasing the same on an emergency basis without sealed bids is necessary and appropriate so that the Village may have a fully functional street sweeper prior to the commencement of street sweeping season.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement to purchase a Johnston VT 650 street sweeper from Brown Equipment Company at a cost not to exceed \$90,000.00, less any applicable trade-in value for the Village's current street sweeper.

SECTION 2: This Council further finds and determines that purchasing the aforementioned street sweeper on an emergency basis without sealed bids is necessary and appropriate so that the Village may have a fully functional street sweeper prior to the commencement of street sweeping season.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF MOGADORE TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT A GRANT FROM THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES RECREATIONAL TRAILS PROGRAM TO SUPPORT THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW TRAIL IN LIONS PARK, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (“ODNR”) Recreational Trails Program has made, or will make, funds available to political subdivisions for certain capital improvements to recreational trails within Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Village intends to undertake certain improvements within Lions Park, including the construction of a new recreational trail; and

WHEREAS, the new recreational trail in Lions Park is a priority of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to apply for, and accept, grant funds from ODNR’s Recreational Trail Program to fund capital costs for the construction of the new recreational trail in Lions Park; and

WHEREAS, the Village will provide the local funds necessary to meet any matching funds requirement of ODNR’s Recreational Trails Program; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village of Mogadore to apply for and accept a grant from the ODNR Recreational Trails Program to support the construction of a new trail in Lions Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The Mayor and all other Village officials are hereby authorized to do all things necessary to apply for a grant from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Recreational Trails Program to support the construction of a new trail in Lions Park.

SECTION 2: The Mayor and all other Village officials are hereby authorized to do all things necessary to accept a grant from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources Recreational Trails Program to support the construction of a new trail in Lions Park.

SECTION 3: The Mayor is further authorized to sign any and all documents and/or agreements on behalf of the Village as may be necessary and appropriate for the design and construction of the new trail in Lions Park upon acceptance of the grant funds.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2022-90, SECTION 1, REGARDING THE WAGES FOR PART-TIME POLICE OFFICERS IN THE VILLAGE'S POLICE DEPARTMENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Section 3.10 of the Charter of the Village provides Council with the authority to create positions, duties, compensation and fix qualifications for employees of the Village; and

WHEREAS, Council has previously deemed it necessary and advisable to create part-time police officer positions within the Village's Police Department; and

WHEREAS, this Council desires to provide for an amendment to the pay of such part-time police officer positions to provide for such part-time police officers to receive compensation at a rate of two (2) times the rate of pay for holidays worked by such part-time police officers; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village of Mogadore to amend the pay of the part-time police officer positions of the Village to provide for such part-time police officers to receive compensation at a rate of two (2) times the rate of pay for holidays worked by such part-time police officers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: Section 1 of Ordinance 2022-90 is hereby amended as follows:

Effective January 1, 2023, the part-time police officer positions shall be compensated at the starting hourly rate of \$16.96 per hour until successful completion of the training period with the department. Upon successful completion of the training, compensation will then be increased to \$19.62 per hour. In addition, part-time officers will receive a clothing and equipment allowance of \$500.00 annually. Effective, December 24, 2022, all part-time police officers shall receive pay for hours worked on any holiday recognized by the Village at a rate of two (2) times the part-time police officer's regular rate of pay, provided, however, that such holiday pay shall be paid for hours actually worked on the actual holiday rather than upon the day in which the holiday is observed (New Years Day shall be January 1, 2023 and Christmas Eve shall be December 24, 2023).

SECTION 2: All other ordinances, resolutions, or parts of other ordinances or resolutions which may be in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared null and void and are of no further force and effect.

A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION 2020-79, SECTION 2, REGARDING THE WAGES FOR THE PART-TIME SNOW PLOW DRIVER POSITION WITHIN THE VILLAGE'S STREET DEPARTMENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Section 3.10 of the Charter of the Village provides Council with the authority to create positions, duties, compensation and fix qualifications for employees of the Village; and

WHEREAS, Council has previously deemed it necessary and advisable to create a part-time snow plow driver position within the Village's Street Department; and

WHEREAS, this Council desires to provide for an amendment to the pay of such part-time snow plow driver position to provide for such part-time snow plow drivers to receive compensation at a rate of two (2) times the rate of pay for holidays worked by such part-time snow plow drivers; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village of Mogadore to amend the pay of the part-time snow plow driver positions to provide for such part-time snow plow drivers to receive compensation at a rate of two (2) times the rate of pay for holidays worked by such part-time snow plow drivers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: Section 2 of Resolution No. 2020-79 is hereby amended as follows:

The part-time position within the Street Department will be an as-needed snow plow driver position. A current CDL is required for the position. Said part-time position shall be compensated for such services at an hourly rate of \$20.00, payable semi-monthly. Effective, December 24, 2022, the part-time snow plow driver shall receive pay for hours worked on any holiday recognized by the Village at a rate of two (2) times the part-time snow plow driver's regular rate of pay, provided, however, that such holiday pay shall be paid for hours actually worked on the actual holiday rather than upon the day in which the holiday is observed (New Years Day shall be January 1, 2023 and Christmas Eve shall be December 24, 2023).

SECTION 2: All other ordinances, resolutions, or parts of other ordinances or resolutions which may be in conflict with the provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared null and void and are of no further force and effect.

A ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE HOLIDAYS FOR ALL NON-BARGAINING EMPLOYEES OF THE VILLAGE FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2023, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village of Mogadore to establish the holidays for all non-bargaining employees of the Village for calendar year 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: This Council hereby establishes the following holidays for all non-bargaining employees of the Village for calendar year 2023:

January 2, 2023	New Year's Day Observed
January 16, 2023	Martin Luther King Day
May 29, 2023	Memorial Day
July 4, 2023	Independence Day
September 4, 2023	Labor Day
November 23, 2023	Thanksgiving Holiday
November 24, 2023	Thanksgiving Holiday
December 25, 2023	Christmas Day
December 26, 2023	Christmas Eve observed

SECTION 2: All full-time non-bargaining employees shall receive pay for holidays worked based on prior legislation adopted by this Council.

SECTION 3: All part-time non-bargaining employees shall receive pay for hours worked on any holiday set forth in Section 1 at a rate of two (2) times the employee's regular rate of pay, provided, however, that such holiday pay shall be paid for hours actually worked on the actual holiday rather than upon the day in which the holiday is observed (New Years Day shall be January 1, 2023 and Christmas Eve shall be December 24, 2023).

SECTION 4: All other ordinances, resolutions, or parts of other ordinances or resolutions which may be in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared null and void and are of no further force and effect.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO PARTICIPATE IN LITIGATION SETTLEMENTS WITH OPIOID MANUFACTURERS, TEVA AND ALLERGAN, AND PHARMACIES, CVS, WALGREENS AND WALMART, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, certain litigation has been brought by several states and local political subdivisions against opioid manufacturers, Teva and Allergan, as well as pharmacies, CVS, Walgreens and Walmart; and

WHEREAS, the Village has been notified that settlements have been reached in the aforementioned litigation in excess of \$20 billion; and

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio has elected to participate in such settlements; and

WHEREAS, to participate in the settlement and receive settlement funds, it is necessary for the Village to opt-in, and the Village will receive no settlement funds if it does not elect to opt-in; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village of Mogadore to authorize the Mayor to execute and deliver all documents necessary to participate in litigation settlements with opioid manufacturers, Teva and Allergan, as well as pharmacies, CVS, Walgreens and Walmart.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute and deliver all documents necessary to participate in litigation settlements with opioid manufacturers, Teva and Allergan, as well as pharmacies, CVS, Walgreens and Walmart.

SECTION 2: This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SPONSOR: PARKS COMMITTEE

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF MOGADORE TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY OF SUMMIT TO ACCEPT COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDS FOR REPAIRS AT THE RUSSELL M. PRY COMMUNITY CENTER, AUTHORIZING THE UNDERTAKING OF SUCH REPAIRS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Russell M. Pry Community Center is in need of repairs to its exterior walls; and

WHEREAS, the County of Summit has notified the Village that it has certain Community Development Block Grant (“CDBG”) funds available to grant to the Village to fund the aforementioned repairs; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to accept the CDBG funds from the County of Summit to fund the aforementioned repairs; and

WHEREAS, this Council further desires to authorize the Mayor and all other Village officials to undertake the aforementioned repairs, including the advertisement for, and receipt of, sealed bids for the costs to construct the aforementioned repairs; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village of Mogadore to enter into an agreement with the County of Summit to accept CDBG funds for the aforementioned repairs at the Russell M. Pry Community Center, and to further authorize the undertaking of such repairs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: The Mayor and all other Village officials are hereby authorized to do all things necessary to accept a grant from the County of Summit, Ohio of Community Development Block Grant funds to support the repairs of the exterior walls of the Russell M. Pry Community Center.

SECTION 2: The Mayor and all other Village officials are hereby authorized to undertake the repairs to the exterior walls of the Russell M. Pry Community Center.

SECTION 3: The Mayor is further authorized to advertise for sealed bids, receive such sealed bids and enter to an agreement with the lowest responsive and responsible bidder for the construction of the repairs to the exterior walls of the Russell M. Pry Community Center, and to further sign any and all documents and/or agreements on behalf of the Village as may be necessary and appropriate for the undertaking of the same.

SECTION 6: This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 7: This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the residents of the Village of Mogadore and for the purpose of applying for and accepting the aforementioned grant in a time and manner required by the grant program, and undertaking the aforementioned repairs before they result in further damage to the Russell M. Pry Community Center, and, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected or appointed to this Council, it shall take effect and be in force upon its passage by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
