June 7, 2023

SPONSOR: FINANCE COMMITTEE

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING SECTION 38.14 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF MOGADORE, ENTITLED "GRANT APPLICATIONS AND GRANT AWARD AGREEMENTS," TO AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO APPLY FOR AND EXECUTE GRANT APPLICATIONS AND GRANT AWARD AGREEMENTS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Chapter 38 of the Village of Mogadore Codified Ordinances contains Village policies and procedures; and

WHEREAS, the Village is routinely applying for and entering into grants to benefit the Village and its community; and

WHEREAS, the Codified Ordinances of the Village do not contain a specific section authorizing execution of grant applications and awards by the Mayor, and each application and award agreement must be approved by this Council; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor has recommended that this Council add Section 38.14 of the Codified Ordinances of the Village, entitled "Grant Applications and Grant Award Agreements" as set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference to (i) authorize the Mayor to execute grant applications for grants requiring a Village match equal to or less than \$25,000.00 without Council approval and (ii) authorize the Mayor to execute and grant award agreements that require no Village match; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village to adopt Section 38.14 for the reasons set forth above.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: This Council hereby adopts Section 38.14 of the Codified Ordinances of the Village, entitled "Grant Applications and Grant Award Agreements," as set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2: This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

<u>SECTION 3</u>: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the residents of the Village of Mogadore

38.14 GRANT APPLICATIONS AND GRANT AWARD AGREEMENTS.

The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute grant applications for any grant where the Village's obligation to match or otherwise expend Village funds or share in the expense of the grant activity does not exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000). The Mayor is further authorized to execute any grant award agreements for any grant where the Village is not required to provide any matching funds or otherwise expend Village funds or share in the expense of the grant activity. All other grant applications and grant award agreements may only be signed by the Mayor upon the approval of the Village Council pursuant to a resolution.

SPONSOR: SAFETY COMMITTEE

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING SECTION 76.10 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF MOGADORE, ENTITLED "PARKING OF NON-COMMERCIAL TRAILERS, RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND MOTOR HOMES ON PUBLIC STREETS PROHIBITED," TO PROHIBIT THE PARKING OF NON-COMMERCIAL TRAILERS, RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND MOTOR HOMES ON PUBLIC STREETS AND RIGHT OF WAYS IN THE VILLAGE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Chapter 76 of the Village of Mogadore Codified Ordinances sets forth the traffic code of the Village and provides, in part, for the regulation of parking on public streets and right of ways in the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Police Chief have recommended that this Council adopt Section 76.10 of the Codified Ordinances of the Village, entitled "Parking of Non-Commercial Trailers, Recreational Vehicles and Motor Homes on Public Streets Prohibited," as set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, which will regulate the parking of those items on the streets and right of ways within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Police Chief have recommended the adoption of Section 76.10 for the safety of the residents of the Village and to allow safe and clear passage upon the streets and right of ways in the Village; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village to adopt Section 76.10 for the reasons set forth above.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: This Council hereby adopts Section 76.10 of the Codified Ordinances of the Village, entitled "Parking of Non-Commercial Trailers, Recreational Vehicles and Motor Homes on Public Streets Prohibited," as set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2: This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the residents of the Village of Mogadore and for the purpose of immediately regulating the parking of non-commercial trailers, recreational

Exhibit A Ordinance 2023-42

SECTION 76.10 PARKING OF NON-COMMERCIAL TRAILERS, RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AND MOTOR HOMES ON PUBLIC STREETS PROHIBITED.

- (A) The terms "non-commercial trailer," "mobile home," "recreational vehicle," "travel trailer," "house vehicle," "motor home," "truck camper," "fifth wheel trailer," and "park trailer" shall have the same meanings as those set forth in Section 4501.01 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- (B) No person shall park any non-commercial trailer, mobile home, recreational vehicle, travel trailer, house vehicle, motor home, truck camper, fifth wheel trailer, or park trailer on any street or right-of-way within the Village unless the same is being loaded or unloaded and it is parking in an area where motor vehicles are permitted to park. No loading or unloading permitted under this Section shall exceed four (4) hours in length.
- (C) Any violation of this Section shall be a minor misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of no more than \$150.00. Any second or additional violation of this Section shall not be a waivable offense. Each day that a non-commercial trailer, mobile home, recreational vehicle, travel trailer, house vehicle, motor home, truck camper, fifth wheel trailer, or park trailer is parked in violation of this Section shall constitute a separate violation of this Section.
