AN ORDINANCE REZONING THE REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 176 NORTH CLEVELAND AVENUE FROM AN R-1 ZONING DISTRICT DESIGNATION TO AN R-2 ZONING DISTRICT DESIGNATION, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Section 152.133 of the Village's Codified Ordinances provides this Council the authority to modify the number, shape or area of the districts established by the Codified Ordinances and set forth on the Village's zoning map, including amending said zoning map, provided that the Village complies with the procedural requirements contained therein; and

WHEREAS, the owners of the real property located at 176 North Cleveland Avenue, Mogadore, OH 44260, consisting of 1.016 acres and identified in the Summit County Records as Parcel No. 5500181 (the "Property") previously filed an application with the Clerk-Treasurer to rezone the Property from an R-1 zoning district designation to an R-2 zoning district designation; and

WHEREAS, following proper notice, this Council and the Village's Planning Commission held a joint hearing on the application for the rezoning of the Property from an R-1 zoning district designation to an R-2 zoning district designation on June 12, 2023, pursuant to Section 152.133 of the Village's Codified Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, on June 26, 2023, the Village's Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend the rezoning of the Property from an R-1 zoning district designation to an R-2 zoning district designation; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village to rezone the Property from an R-1 zoning district designation to an R-2 zoning district as set forth herein, and to amend the Village's zoning map accordingly.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: Pursuant to Section 152.133 of the Village's Codified Ordinances, this Council hereby rezones the Property from an R-1 zoning district designation to an R-2 zoning district.

SECTION 2: The Village's zoning map is hereby amended to reflect the Property as part of the Village's R-2 zoning district designation.

SECTION 3: This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SPONSOR: STREETS COMMITTEE

AN ORDINANCE VACATING SPRING STREET AND MILL STREET WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF MOGADORE UPON THE SATISFACTION OF CERTAIN CONDITIONS BY THE WHEELING AND LAKE ERIE RAILWAY COMPANY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Section 723.05 of the Ohio Revised Code authorizes this Council to adopt an ordinance to vacate any street or alley in the Village provided that this Council determines that there is good cause for vacating the street or alley, or any part thereof, and that such vacation will not be detrimental to the general interest of the public; and

WHEREAS, Spring Street is currently located within the Village of Mogadore, running west off of South Cleveland Avenue to a dead end; Mill Street runs south off of the aforementioned Spring Street. Collectively, Spring Street and Mill Street are comprised of 1.294 acres, and are bordered by The Wheeling and Lake Erie Railway Company, Brayden J. Guyer, and Carter Jones Lumber Company; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds that there is good cause for vacating Spring Street and Mill Street, as more fully depicted on the Spring/Mill Street Road Vacation Plat attached hereto as Exhibit A, given that the streets are no longer used for public purposes; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds that the vacation of Spring Street and Mill Street will not be detrimental to the general interest of the public; and

WHEREAS, as a condition to the vacation of Spring Street and Mill Street, The Wheeling and Lake Erie Railway Company must undertake certain actions before the Mayor is authorized to sign the vacation plat, to-wit:

- (i) An access drive must be installed by The Wheeling and Lake Erie Railway Company upon its parcel at a location approved by the Village Engineer.
- (ii) The Wheeling and Lake Erie Railway Company must remove all asphalt on the vacated portion of Spring Street between North Cleveland Avenue and the railroad overpass to the west, and subsequently fill and seed the same, to the Village Engineer's satisfaction.
- (iii) The Wheeling and Lake Erie Railway Company must install and/or repair the sidewalk that runs along North Cleveland Avenue in the to-be-vacated portion of Spring Street and the balance of the property owned by said Company along North Cleveland Avenue, to the Village Engineer's satisfaction.
- (iv) The Wheeling and Lake Erie Railway Company must clean-up the fill material used to fill in under the railroad overpass crossing the to-be-vacated Spring Street.
- (v) The Wheeling and Lake Erie Railway Company must execute and/or provide a performance guaranty that the above items will be completed.

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village to vacate Spring Street and Mill Street within the municipal limits of the Village of Mogadore as set forth on Exhibit A, upon the completion of the conditions in the immediately preceding recital paragraph.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:

SECTION 1: This Council hereby orders and declares, upon satisfaction of the conditions set forth in the recitals, above, as the same will be certified by the Village Engineer, that Spring Street and Mill Street be vacated by the Village, as more fully set forth and depicted on the Spring/Mill Street Road Vacation Plat attached hereto as Exhibit A.

SECTION 2: This Council hereby authorizes the Mayor and Village Engineer, only upon the satisfaction of the conditions set forth in the recitals, above, to execute the Spring/Mill Street Road Vacation Plat in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A.

SECTION 3: The Clerk-Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to file the Spring/Mill Street Road Vacation Plat and a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Summit County Fiscal Officer at the appropriate time.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: The Mayor, Clerk-Treasurer and Village Engineer are hereby authorized to execute and enter into any agreements necessary to effectuate the conditions to the vacation of Spring Street and Mill Street set forth in the recitals.

SECTION 5: This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were taken in open meetings of this Council and any deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in this formal action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the residents of the Village of Mogadore and for the purpose of immediately vacating Spring Street and Mill Street so that the same may be utilized by The Wheeling and Lake Erie Railway Company to improve its operations within the Village, and, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members elected or appointed to this Council, it shall take effect and be in force upon its passage by Council and approval by the Mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Resolution 2023-55

This agreement is entered into this	day of August 2023 by and between the Village of
Mogadore, Ohio (hereinafter referred to a	s the Village) and the Ohio Patrolman's Association
(hereinafter referred to as the OPBA).	

Whereas, in the exercise of its management rights guaranteed by the collective bargaining agreement, the Village has determined to establish a canine program.

Now, therefor, the parties hereby agree as follows with the regard to the effects of the establishment of the canine program on the bargaining unit members:

- 1. The K-9 Officer and the dog shall compromise a single purpose/ patrol related canine unit as defined in the Ohio Administrative Code. The K-9 Officer agrees to maintain the necessary certifications of the canine unit as required by the Ohio Administrative Code.
- 2. The Chief of Police will determine who is assigned to the K-9 position. The officer selected serves at the discretion of the Chief of Police and can be removed for unsatisfactory performance. The K-9 position has a one-year probationary period.
- 3. The K-9 Officer shall work 40 hours per week, the current 12-hour shift schedule or a schedule that is approved by the Chief of Police. The K-9 Officer shall be provided 1 hour per shift off as compensation for the care and maintenance of the dog. The K-9 Officer will be scheduled to work 7 hours or 11 hours shift of the standard 8- or 12-hour shifts. If due to a manpower coverage the K-9 Officer cannot utilize this format, they will be compensated by pay as straight time, which will be submitted on a time sheet at the end of that shifts pay period.
- 4. The Village may direct the K-9 Officer to adjust the time spent caring for the canine and routine veterinary care. The Village shall compensate with overtime pay when accompanying the dog for veterinary care if such care is an emergency and occurs during the K-9 Officer's non-working hours. Routine travel time transporting the dog to and from the officer's residence shall not be compensated.
- 5. The K-9 Officer's training days (and frequency) will be assigned at the discretion of the Chief of Police. The K-9 Officer will attend 40 hours or one week of refresher training per year, which is necessary to maintain certifications as required by the Ohio Administrative

Code. Said time will be in lieu of the K-9 Officers regular scheduled shift. The K-9 Officers will not perform any additional training, nor shall the Village compensate the K-9 Officer for any addition training unless first approved by the Chief of Police.

- 6. The K-9 Officer waives selection of shifts and days off and further agrees that assignment of hours and days off are at the discretion of the Chief of Police and are flexible to meet the needs of any training function or special assignment without overtime unless first approved by the Chief of Police.
- 7. The Village shall provide the K-9 Officer with the police department vehicle designated to transport the canine for official purposes. The Village shall provide the K-9 Officer with all animal necessities including equipment, food, veterinary care, and medication.
- 8. The canine is the property of the Village of Mogadore. The handler shall not alter or breed the dog without the permission of the Chief of Police. The handler may apply to purchase the canine for \$1 where: the canine has been retired, relieved of duty due to illness, injury or if the handler retires in good standing and decision is made by the Chief of Police and Public Safety Director not to retain the dog for another handler.
- 9. All other terms and provisions of the collective bargaining agreement between the Village and the OPBA shall remain in full force and effect.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT A CONGESTION MITIGATION AIR QUALITY PROGRAM GRANT FROM THE AKRON METROPOLITAN AREA TRANSPORTATION STUDY TO ACQUIRE AND INSTALL A NEW TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT THE INTERSECTION OF NORTH CLEVELAND AVENUE AND ALBRECHT AVENUE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study ("AMATS") has made, or will make, funds available for Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Program grants; and

WHEREAS, the Village has identified the need for the acquisition and installation of a new traffic signal at the intersection of North Cleveland Avenue and Albrecht Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to apply for, and accept, grant funds from AMATS' Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Program to fund the acquisition and installation of a new traffic signal at the intersection of North Cleveland Avenue and Albrecht Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Village will be responsible for committing local funds to the aforementioned project in the amount of \$109,072.00, which may also come from Ohio Public Works Commission funds; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary and in the best interest of the Village of Mogadore to apply for and accept a grant from AMATS' Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Program to fund the acquisition and installation of a new traffic signal at the intersection of North Cleveland Avenue and Albrecht Avenue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Mogadore, Counties of Summit and Portage, State of Ohio, that:
